Anaerobic Digestion Facility and Food Scraps Collection Update



We are making progress!

In this photo, taken on March 24th, the crew is preparing to pour cement for the roof covering the percolate tanks. The tanks will have access ports to the 8 digesters where the mix of food scraps and garden trimmings are composting. The liquids and beneficial bacteria from the composting material will flow into the percolate tanks and then recirculate back to the digesters to promote the composting process.

Recycling Containers From Recycle Cart to Sorting Line

Customers have asked us why they need to separate containers from paper products when they are dumped together into the same truck. It does appear that way, but when then the split recycle cart is dumped, the butterfly lids help the paper, under the gray lid, to fall into the paper compartment and the



containers, under the blue lid, to fall into a separate compartment.

When the truck returns to Blue Line Transfer with a full load, the driver first backs into the paper recycling area and raises the back door of the paper compartment to dump the paper. Next, the driver goes to the container recycling area and raises the door of the container compartment to dump the load as shown in the picture. Then the containers are scooped onto a conveyor belt which delivers the materials to an elevated sorting line.

The employees on the sorting line hand sort each glass bottle by color — green, clear and brown. They also hand sort each plastic container by color and number — mixed color, natural, clear. They hand pick the bags of batteries and cell phones too. Tin and aluminum cans are the only containers that are sorted mechanically.

Meanwhile, on the paper sorting line, the workers look for any garbage, plastic and other items to remove from the paper. Keeping the paper separate from the bottles and cans ensures that the paper is clean and dry and will be accepted at the mill.
