California Laws Require Proper Waste Sorting

Assembly Bill 1826 requires businesses to



implement an organics recycling program. Currently, it targets those generating 4 cubic yards or more of <u>organic</u> waste per week. On January 1, 2019, the law will apply to those generating 4 cubic yards or more of <u>garbage</u> per week.







Assembly Bill 341 requires businesses and multifamily dwellings to separate recyclable

materials from their garbage and either allow

the collection of recyclables by SSF Scavenger

or self-haul to a recycling facility. The law applies to

of garbage per week and to all multifamily dwellings

businesses that generate four or more cubic yards
