- Regularly remind all staff, tenants, and contractors to sort waste items correctly and to report any problems.

- Plastic wrap, bags, cups, lids, straws, and utensils
- ✓ Broken kitchen plates & glasses, ceramic vases, and similar housewares
- ✓ Worn-out clothing, shoes, and linens
- ✓ Aseptic (Tetra Pak) soup, juice, and milk boxes

Please put these items in your Garbage cart or bin.
