Awarded Climate Registered™ Gold Status  
and Joins Ranks of US Climate Leaders**

South San Francisco Scavenger Company (SSF Scavenger) was awarded Climate Registered™ Gold Status by The Climate Registry, a nonprofit organization that is governed by U.S. states and operates the Carbon Footprint Registry, which is North America's largest voluntary registry for greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. SSF Scavenger earned this recognition by publicly reporting a third-party verified GHG emissions inventory for its operations. This data will enable them to track their climate initiatives and GHG reductions credibly over time.

"It is our goal to operate in a way that helps our communities achieve zero waste, while significantly reducing our overall GHG emissions," explains Doug Button, President of SSF Scavenger.

"Organizations that become Climate Registered™ are the leaders in a growing movement to address climate change by managing and reducing emissions at the subnational level," said Amy Holm, Executive Director of The Climate Registry. "We have just over a decade to take action that will ensure we avoid the worst effects of climate change. This kind of leadership is needed now more than ever."
