# **New Disposable Foodware Ordinance Aims to Reduce Plastic Pollution**

The County of San Mateo and several local cities including South San Francisco, Millbrae, and Brisbane, have adopted a Disposable Foodware

Ordinance. It became effective on October 1, 2022.

The Ordinance aims to reduce waste by eliminating disposable foodware (cups, plates, clamshells, straws, utensils, etc.) that isn't reusable or compostable,

especially plastic foodware that persists in the environment and contains harmful chemicals. The Ordinance requires restaurants and other food facilities that serve prepared food to use natural fiber-based compostable foodware. Aligning

with new state law (AB 1276), accessories such as utensils. straws.

State law (Senate Bill 1383) and corresponding local ordinances require Californians to separate yard waste, food scraps, food-soiled paper, clean paper and cardboard from their garbage. Why not make it your New Year's resolution to fully comply
