Correct Sorting Required

State law (SB 1383) and local ordinances require that organic waste be sorted from landfill-bound garbage.

To avoid service delays, extra fees and citations:

- **1.** Place food scraps, food-soiled paper, and yard trimmings in your "Organics Only" bin.
- 2. Place clean/dry paper in your "Paper Only" recycling bin.
- **3.** Place clean/dry, flattened corrugated boxes in your "Cardboard Only" recycling bin. In the absence of a cardboard bin, place in your paper recycling bin.
- **4.** Be careful not to contaminate the materials in your organics and recycling bins with items that do no belong. Did You Know?

In California, all waste collection bins must be clearly labeled to indicate common items that do and do not belong inside. They must also be:

- Grey or black for garbage
- Blue for recyclables
- Green for organics/compostables
